

The Federalist Names Sean Davis As CEO

Sean Davis was called chief executive officer of The Federalist, Editor-In-Chief Mollie Hemingway revealed on Monday. Davis, who co-founded the The Federalist in 2013 and has served as its chief monetary officer because its development, will now manage and handle all of the business's operations.
